Using the volunteers own cars you can be picked up from your home at a time convenient to you (within reason) and taken to that all important appointment that you cannot miss, go to visit friends, both locally and further afield, go to the shops or library. HCT can even arrange transport to get you to and from your UK holiday destination.

HCT offer wheelchair accessible vehicles and a mini-bus for group transport.

If you are a wheelchair user and find it impossible to travel by public transport and find transferring to a car or taxi difficult, the Barbara Bus Fund (Stanmore) may be able to help with its fleet of six specially adapted vehicles which enable wheelchair users to travel without transferring.

Friends, relatives or carers may be nominated to drive the vehicles, providing they are aged between 25 and 75 years of age and have a current & clean full driving license. You may use the vehicles to travel whenever and wherever you wish up to a maximum continuous period of two weeks.
